[&]quot;If "A" suits your case, cross out "I" and "C" and put the full estimated cost in the blank space provided in Article 3 above.

"If "B" applies, cross out "A" and "C" and fill in the blank space in Article 3 above with the difference between the total estimated cost and the amount provided heretofore by one or more budget appropriations.

"If "C" is applicable, cross out "A" and "B" and fill in the blank space provided in Article 3 above with the total estimated cost.
